JR Keiyo Line: Get off at Shin-kiba Station/3 min. walk
Yurakucho Line: Get off at Shin-kiba Station/3 min. walk
Rinkai Line: Get off at Shin-kiba Station/3 min. walk

Minato-ga-oka Port Park



■ **Features:** A park around a small hill behind the port. Visitors can enjoy strolling along tree-lined paths or having picnics.

■ **Location:** 3 chome Yashio, Shinagawa-ku

■ **Parking :** 16 spots



Access

Toei Bus: From the Konan-guchi Exit of JR Shinagawa Station, get on the Route 98 Kou/Otsu (品98甲・乙) bus and get off at Tokyo Zeikan Oi Shucchojo/3 min. walk

Keihinjima Tsubasa Park



■ **Features:** Park has approx. 1km of shoreline facing Haneda Airport. View planes as they take off and land and imagine your own vacation.

■ **Location:** 2 chome Keihinjima, Ota-ku

■ **Parking :** 13 spots



Access

Keikey Bus: From the East Exit of JR Omori Station, Keikey Omori Kaigan or Heiwajima stations, get on the Route 24 or 36 (森24 or 36) bus and get off at Keihinjima Kaijo Park

Keihin Canalside Greenway



■ **Features:** Greenway extends for approx. 2.5 km. Can walk the equivalent of one station when going to and from the racetrack or seaside park.

■ **Location:** 1 and 5 chome Yashio, Shinagawa-ku



Access

Monorail: Get off at Oi Keibajo Mae Station /4 min. walk
Toei Bus: From the Konan-guchi Exit of JR Shinagawa Station, take the Route 91 (品91) bus and get off at Shinagawa Sogo Fukushi Center Mae



Umi-no-Mori Park

Forest Creation Area is currently under construction and is closed to visitors, including for photography/filming. Please visit during special openings or when events are held.

About Umi-no-Mori Project

Umi-no-Mori is a project that will transform a portion of the Inner Central Breakwater Reclamation Area, located at the entrance to the Port of Tokyo, into a forest with a planned area of approximately 149 hectares (including 54 hectares of water).

2 Features

Recycling resources: Tokyo have been working to create a forest that places importance on recycling resources, including making compost from leaves and branches pruned at Tokyo parks or from roadside trees, and then mixing that with soil generated by construction projects to create soil.

Collaboration with citizens: A community project in collaboration with private enterprises was completed in fall 2015. Currently, development of the forest is continuing through weeding, thinning and so on.

Composting



Pruned leaves and branches from landscaping work performed in the parks and for roadside trees in Tokyo's 23 wards were turned into the compost needed as the foundation to plant Umi-no-Mori. This made effective use of resources and cuts costs. (Completed in FY2016)
