Park rangers are happy to offer explanations and answer questions on the lifestyles of birds in the park and the surrounding natural environment. Tokyo Port Wild Bird Park also offers observation programs with content tailored to specific requests for school field trips nature events conducted by local clubs (book in advance).

A place for volunteering

Tokyo Port Wild Bird Park is also a place where volunteers engage in such activities as environmental management, providing nature education to visitors, and managing events. The park is always accepting new volunteers.

East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership

The East Asian-Australasian Flyway Partnership is an international project in which countries and NGOs from regions where the waterfowl of Japan and other nations migrate such as the U.S., Russia, China, South Korea, Southeast Asia, and Australia work together to promote the preservation of waterfowl and the wetlands which are their habitat. Tokyo Port Wild Bird Park, together with other areas such as Yatsu-higata, Osaka Nankou Bird Sanctuary, and the mouth of the Kuma River in Kumamoto Prefecture, participates in this partnership as an important habitat for sandpipers and plovers.



In the spring and summer, the group holds nature observation events and carries out activities aimed at educating Tokyo residents about the natural environment of Nagisa Forest.






About Umi-no-Mori Project

Umi-no-Mori is a project that will transform a portion of the Inner Central Breakwater Reclamation Area, located at the entrance to the Port of Tokyo, into a forest with a planned area of approximately 149 hectares (including 54 hectares of water).

2 Features

Recycling resources: Tokyo have been working to create a forest that places importance on recycling resources, including making compost from leaves and branches pruned at Tokyo parks or from roadside trees, and then mixing that with soil generated by construction projects to create soil.

Collaboration with citizens: A community project in collaboration with private enterprises was completed in fall 2015. Currently, development of the forest is continuing with cultivation efforts such as weeding and thinning.

Umi-no-Mori Club

Umi-no-Mori Club is made up of members, including companies, that support the Umi-no-Mori project. Through a diverse array of exciting events held by members, Umi-no-Mori is introduced to the many who attend.
