Sightseeing Spots

Izu Oshima Geopark



Izu Oshima is under the jurisdiction of Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park. About 97% of Oshima is protected by the National Parks Law concerning natural landscapes and the ecosystem. Izu Oshima is certified as a Japanese Geopark because one can learn about the connection between people, geology, and nature while enjoying the natural sights of the island.

Stratum Section

This geological feature was formed over a period of 15,000 years by hundreds of Mt. Mihara's eruptions. It is nearly 30 meters tall and extends over 800 meters.



Mt. Mihara

An active volcano that still emits smoke to this day, Mt. Mihara is Oshima's most prominent symbol. There are many related spots in the vicinity (Ura Sabaku Desert, Mihara Shrine, Miharayama Hot Spring, Volcano Museum, etc.).



Hamanoyu (hot spring)

Enjoy undisturbed views of the Pacific Ocean while bathing at Hamanoyu. This hot spring features a mixed outdoor bath and requires everyone to wear bathing suits. Make sure to catch sunset here; the view from the bath is stunning.



Camellias

It is said that there are about 3 million wild camellia trees in Oshima. At the island's several camellia gardens, you can see a range of camellias with different blooming periods, colors, and size.

Sightseeing Spots

■ Habushiura Coast

This white-sand beach on the island's east coast extends for 6.5 km. Its impressive waves have made it a popular surfing spot.



■ Yunohama Hot Spring

The outdoor hot spring hugs the coastline and has an eye-catching landmark styled after an ancient temple. Bathing is possible 24 hours a day, the hot spring features a footbath as well as regular baths (bathing suit required).



■ Niijima Glass Art Center

The hands-on glass workshop is a popular activity. Visitors can make their own olive green glass art from kohga stone.



■ Niijima village Museum

In addition to exhibits on the culture and natural surroundings of Niijima Village, a traditional Niijima-style home has been relocated outside the museum. The museum houses the only collection of surfboards in Japan, many from the 1960s.

Sightseeing Spots

■ Dark Sky Island

Kozushima is the first island in Tokyo to be designated as an International Dark Sky Park (a Dark Sky Island) for its efforts to preserve the dark night sky and protect the nocturnal environment. You can take a stargazing tour with a local guide, appreciate the starry night sky and marvel at the grandeur of the universe.



■ Mt. Tenjo

Called "the scenic lookout floating in the Black Current," Mt. Tenjo offers panoramic views of the Izu Islands, the Izu Peninsula, Mt. Fuji and other landmarks.



■ Akasaki Promenade

This 500-meter-long wooden walkway is located at Akasaki Inlet, where there are also a suspended bridge, a scenic lookout, and a diving board.



■ Maehama Beach

The white sand beach stretching for 800 meters is also a romantic spot for watching the sunset over the Pacific.

Sightseeing Spots

■ Ako Lave Flow Trail

This recreation trail will give you a close-up view of the devastating and destructive power of an erupting volcano.



■ Siitori Shrine

This shrine is dedicated to Shiritaki no Mikoto, one of Sakitamahime no Mikoto's Sons. This whole area was buried under mudflows on the 2000 eruption of the volcano.



■ Akakokko-kan (Miyakejima Nature Center)

There are exhibits and materials on display about the wild birds on the islands, as well as an observation space with periscopes that visitors can use to view birds in their natural habitats.



■ Shichito Observatory

On clear days, you can see the other islands in the Izu Islands chain from the side of Mt. Oyama.



■ Tairo-ike Pond

A caldera lake formed about 2,000 years ago, Tairo-ike Pond is surrounded by forests of glossy-leaved trees and is home to the Izu thrush and other bird species.



■ Megane-iwa Rock

This unusual rock formation is near the promenade of Imasaki Beach. It used to have two large holes that made it look like a pair of glasses (megane).

Sightseeing Spots

Hike up Mt. Hachijo-Fuji

Mt.Hachijo-Fuji is located in the northwestern part of the island and offers the best view of the ocean on a clear day. Near the seventh station, you can see cattle grazing leisurely in a grassy field at the Fureai Ranch.



Kihachijo(Hachijojima Silk Fabric)

Hachijojima is famous for "kihachijo", woven silk fabric dyed using trees and plants native to the island. Today, "kihachijo" kimonos meet a wide range of needs, and small products and other simple souvenirs are sold on the island. You can try on the kimono and experience weaving on the textile loom.



Jinya Ruins (Ozato Tamaishigaki)

This wall, made from naturally rounded stones collected from the beach, is a typical sight on Hachijojima.



Site of Hattori Residence

"Kashitate-Odori" folk dance, an intangible folk cultural property designated by Tokyo Metropolitan Government, and "Hachijyo-Daiko" drumming will be per-formed at 10:00 a.m.

Minamijima

The views of the white sands of Ogi-Ike are truly exceptional. Note that you need a licensed guide to enter this area.



Whale watching

December-May is humpback whale-watching season, while May-November is prime time for sperm whale-watching. Humpback whales in particular put on a great show. Witness the whales swimming in the freedom of the ocean.



Kominato Beach

This white sandy beach of shoals is a peaceful cove. Its calm waves make for a very pleasant swimming experience.



Chihiroiwa (heart rock)

When viewed from the sea, the red rock face appears heart-shaped, so the cliff is also called "heart rock". Chihiroiwa is a remarkable sight, especially when seen from the waters of Maruberi Bay. Its rusty red color is said to be the effect of rainfall washing away its surface.
