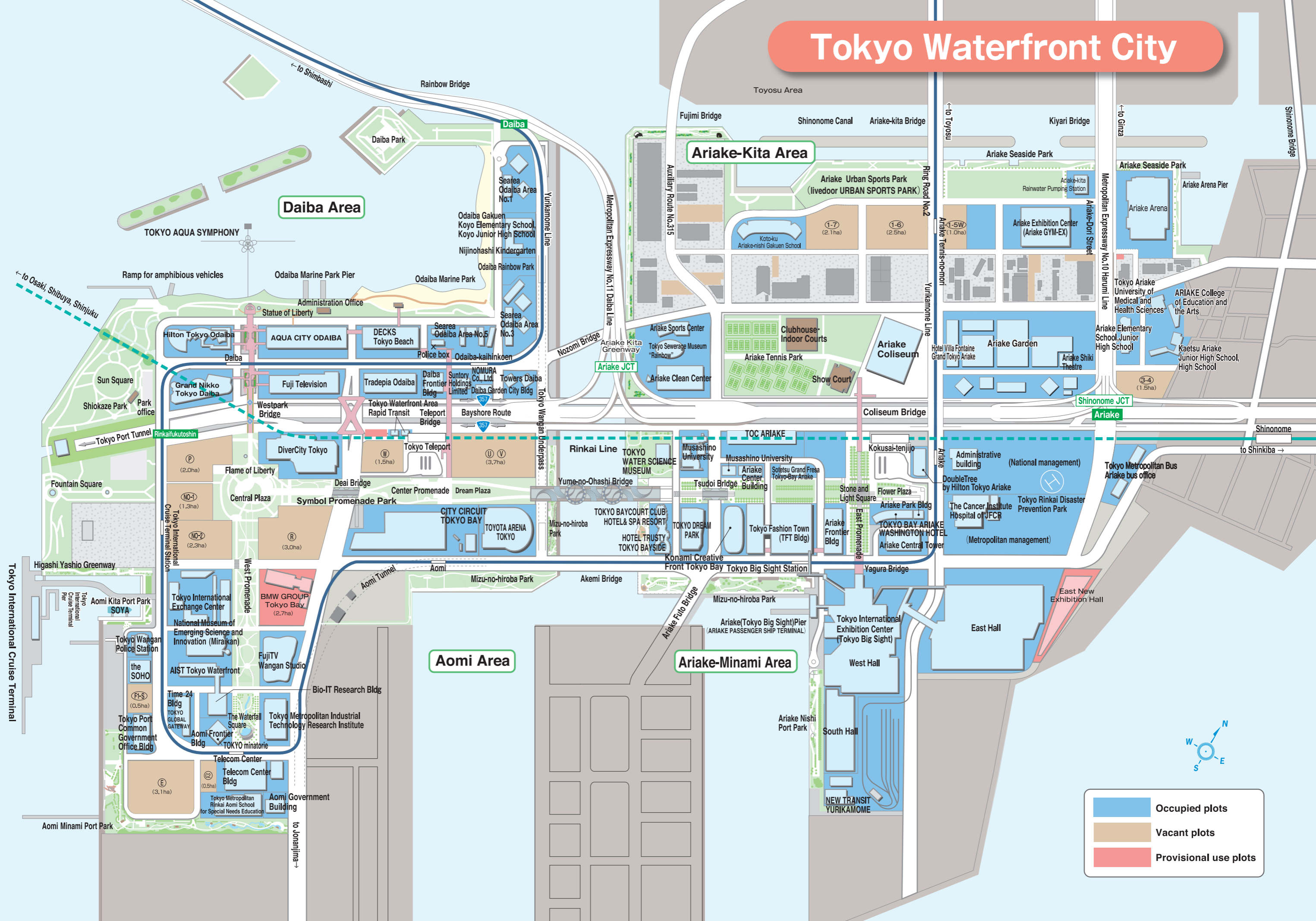

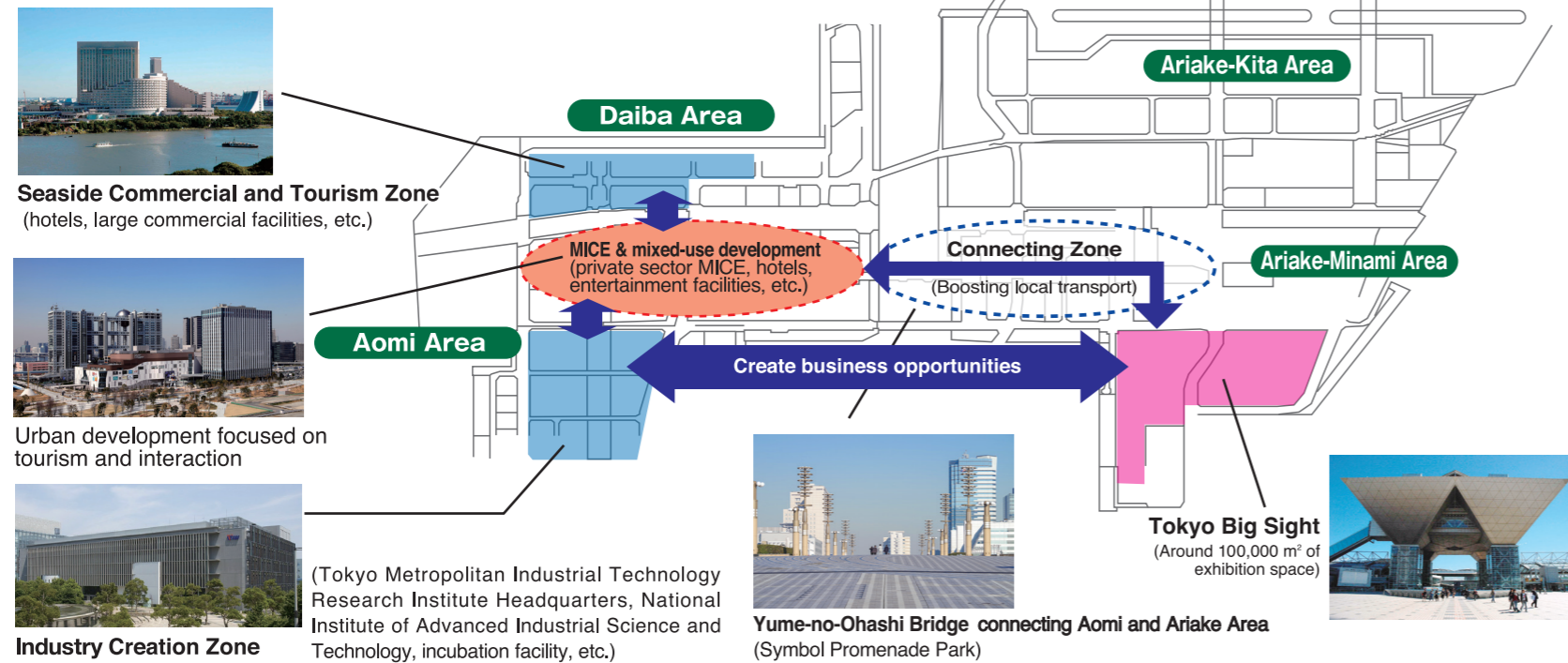

MICE: An acronym for Meetings, Incentive Travel, Convention, and Event/Exhibition



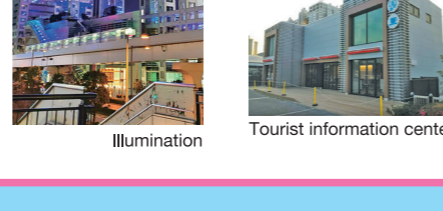
Good Access to the City Center & Airports

- Tokyo Waterfront City is not only located close to Haneda Airport (Tokyo International Airport) but is also ideally positioned for sightseeing via water bus, providing great views of Tokyo Skytree on route to the famous tourist site of Asakusa.

Attractive tourism resources

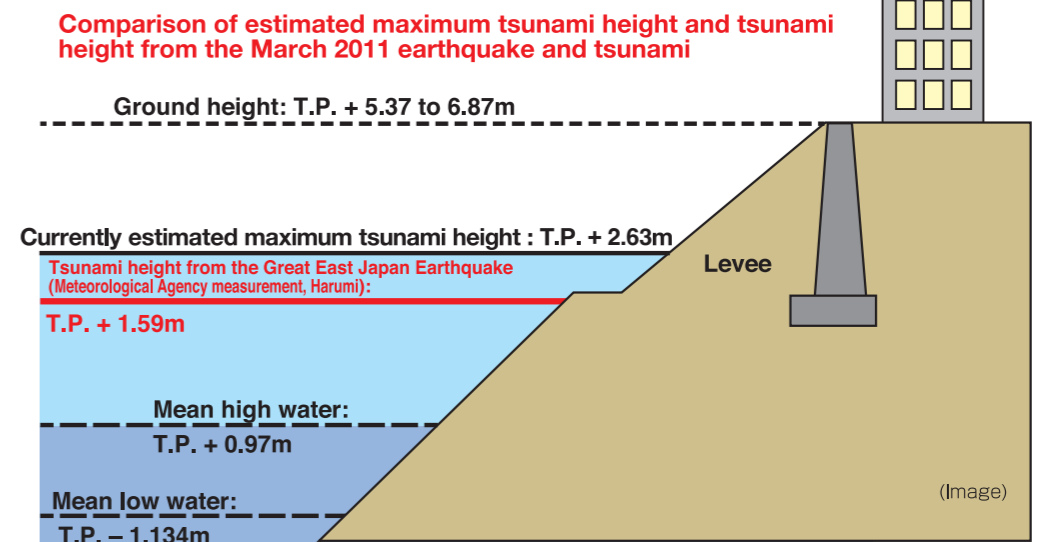
- Tokyo International Cruise Terminal**
Opened in 2020 as Tokyo's gateway to the sea, this facility features a 4th-floor observation deck offering a stunning panoramic view and the sight of cruise ships. It also serves as a versatile venue for events and a filming location.
- Illumination Island Odaiba**
Each commercial facilities in Odaiba area expands an individualized illumination, which brings about Illumination Island that light up the whole Tokyo Water Front City and welcomes any visitors and tourists.

Enhancing hospitality for foreign visitors

- Tokyo Odaiba Free Wi-Fi**
Free access to Wi-Fi has been set up in public spaces in Tokyo Waterfront City, allowing visitors from Japan and overseas to obtain information and communicate with ease.
- Tourist information center open at Tokyo Tell-port Center station**
Concierges recognizing Japanese and English correspond your demand accurately and graciously that give you useful local guidance of Tokyo, especially Odaiba with utilizing digital signage and a lot of communication tools.
- Latest local information transmission, "Digital Signage"**
Providing multilingual information of the Waterfront City, a touch panel signage located at commercial buildings, hotels and exhibition facility of the City.

Safe & Secure City

- Various disaster mitigation measures have been taken to make Tokyo Waterfront City well prepared for disasters. Ample safety has been secured to protect the city against the highest tsunami assumed in Tokyo's report of damage estimates in the event of an earthquake directly hitting the capital, announced in May 2022.
- At the time of the March 2011 earthquake and tsunami, buildings and facilities in Tokyo Waterfront City suffered no big damages from liquefaction, demonstrating that measures taken up to then were effective.
